The intention of Woodall Public School is to provide options for quality learning opportunities that meet the needs of all students and families. We will offer the following pathways for receiving instruction in the fall of 2020.

Traditional Learning

In-School Classes

Students attend classes on campus with Woodall teachers. Extra precautions will be taken to limit exposure to the COVID-19 virus. This is considered the most effective form of instruction. If needed, Woodall School may schedule or announce virtual days. During virtual days, all students will stay home and participate in Distance/Online Learning. Instruction on virtual days will be provided online by Woodall teachers. Woodall School will make every effort to provide as much advanced notification as possible to parents when virtual days are needed. Reasons for virtual days could include inclement weather, COVID-19 exposure, or a recommendation from the Oklahoma State Health Department or Oklahoma State Department of Education.

Blended Learning

In-School Classes and Distance/Online Learning Students will attend classes on campus with Woodall Teachers. But if a student needs to be at home due to exposure to COVID-19 or for health and safety concerns, they can transition to Distance/Online learning. Students will follow the lesson plans and attend virtual meetings of a Woodall teacher using our learning management system. Grades and assignments will be the same as traditional in-school classes. Students will be expected to meet deadlines for all assignments. Attendance will be based on completion of assignments and participation in virtual meetings. In this pathway, students can be in and out of distance learning. However, parents cannot move students in and out of distance learning for personal scheduling because students want to stay home a few days, or vacations. If a student chooses Blended Learning for health and safety concerns, then those concerns also extend to extracurricular or school activities and thus student would not be participating in or attending activities.

Distance/Online Learning

Instruction Provided Online Only Offered off campus using Edgenuity as the learning platform. Students will complete all instruction online and will be monitored by a certified teacher provided by Edgenuity. Attendance and grades will be based on completion of assignments. Students enrolled in this pathway must complete a full semester to receive credit and before changing to another option. While Woodall does not recommend this pathway for students, we recognize the need to provide this model for students that are self-disciplined and have the family support needed. Parents will need to monitor learning to ensure student is completing the self-paced lessons in a timely and efficient manner. Both student and a parent will need to meet with the counselor or principal prior to the start of school to ensure the student has the discipline, self-drive, and support needed to be successful within this model.

We are excited to announce that all Woodall students will have access to an electronic device for the 2020-2021 school year. Students will be allowed to take electronic devices home for virtual days or if enrolled in distance/online learning. We will also trv to accommodate families that do not have internet access at home by checking out hot spots.
